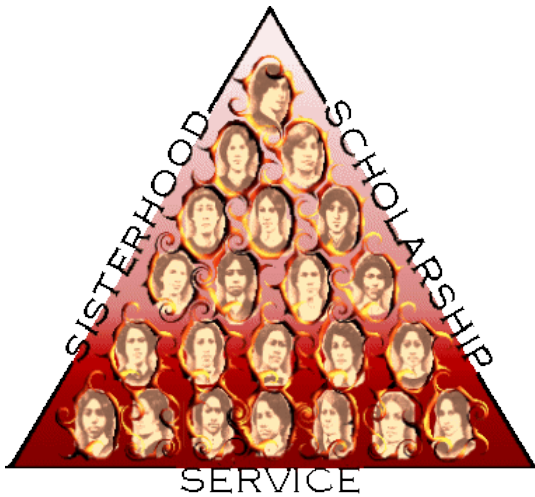

The Sorority's first public act of service was participation in the Women's Suffrage March in Washington D.C., March 1913.
